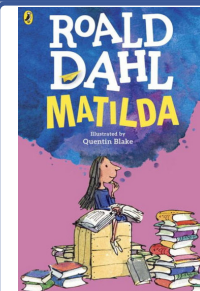

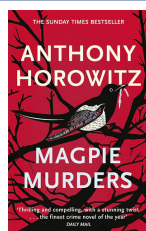
five books by the end of March! Reading logs are available at the library or can be printed from our website. You can also track your progress online using Beanstack! Find the link at our website.
